

**A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING WATER, SEWER AND SOLID
 WASTE FEES AND CHARGES AS PROVIDED BY THE
 CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF
 ADA, OKLAHOMA.**

WHEREAS, the Code of Ordinances of the City of Ada, Oklahoma provides that the fees and charges for various City functions and services shall be set by motion and/or resolution of the City of Ada, Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Ada, Oklahoma, has determined that the fees and charges as set forth in this resolution are fair and reasonable.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Ada, Oklahoma:

THAT the following fees and charges are hereby established in the City of Ada, Oklahoma:

SECTION ONE

WATER RATES

(a) The rates for water furnished by the City **within the corporate limits** of the City shall be as follows:

(d) The rates for water furnished through the use of fire hydrants shall be the same as rates for water in bulk as shown in (c) above.

*The purpose of the Water Development Fund is to provide for development of water rights and/or provide funding for water, sewer and solid waste CIP deemed necessary for the City of Ada

SECTION TWO

SEWER SERVICE CHARGE

For the purpose of providing funds for the maintenance of the sanitary sewage system of the City and for other purposes, there is hereby fixed and established, charges for the use of the sanitary sewer system to be levied against each respective user thereof.

 ** The purpose of the Environmental Project Fund is to provide funding for imposed environmental mandates and/or provide funding for water, sewer and solid waste CIP deemed necessary.

Commercial customers with water usage of approximately 10,000 cubic feet per month may make an application to be exempt and not be billed for more than the maximum charge established above, for commercial users. Such application shall be submitted to the City Manager for his review in such form as he may provide. To qualify for the exemption, the customer must establish to the satisfaction of the City Manager that more than 75% of the average monthly water usage does not flow into the city's sewer or storm water drainage system.

SECTION THREE

GARBAGE COLLECTION CHARGES

(a) A monthly garbage collection fee shall be charged and collected by the City for the collection and disposition of garbage and trash in the residential district, in accordance with the following schedule:

SECTION FOUR

LANDFILL RATES AND CHARGES

All users of the City of Ada Landfill shall be charged the following landfill rates as set forth below:

- (a) Persons residing within the corporate limits of the City of Ada and commercial users whose principal place of business is located within the corporate limits of the City of Ada (must show personal or business identification which provides proof of the city residence or business location) shall pay the sum of \$30.00 per ton with a minimum charge of \$7.50.
- (b) Persons residing outside the corporate limits of the City of Ada and commercial users whose principal place of business is located outside the corporate limits of the City of Ada shall pay the sum of \$45.00 per ton with a minimum charge of \$10.00.
- (c) There shall be a 50% additional charge collected for any loads received at the landfill which are not properly secured in accordance with state statutes and city ordinances to cover the expenses involved in cleaning the approaches to the landfill caused by improperly secured loads.
- (d) Forty percent (40%) of all collections under this Section shall be allocated to the Solid Waste Fund, whose purpose is to provide solutions to solid waste problems and/or provide funding for water, sewer and solid waste CIP deemed necessary.

SECTION FIVE

BRUSH AND MISCELLANEOUS CHARGES

Items placed by the curb on right-of-way will be picked up for hauling to the City landfill. The following charges will apply to these items: (Quadrants and Schedule Defined as per Exhibit A)

1. Grapple Service Program:

- a. All residential solid waste customers: ¹⁾ \$2.00 per month
 - 1. Amount covers up to 4 cubic yards or 3 household items, except items that use Freon (see 1.b below)
 - 2. There is an additional charge for grapple truck service when out of the designated quadrant pickup schedule (see 1.b. below)

¹⁾(of which \$1.00 per month will be allocated to the Solid Waste Development Fund)

Exhibit "A"

"A RESIDENTIAL CURBSIDE COLLECTION SERVICE FOR THE DISPOSAL OF JUNK, BULKY ITEMS & BRUSH."

The City of Ada is beginning a Grapple Truck bulky waste collection for residential dwellings on City garbage service and within the city limits. The City will collect and dispose of bulky waste from residential dwellings, which is placed at the curb in front of the residence adjacent to the public street. No pick up will be made if any vehicle is parked in the street obstructing the debris. Pick-ups will be scheduled by public call ins to the PW Secretary, 436-8100, or by City of Ada employee call ins by City radio to the Grapple Truck (#377) or to the PW Secretary (#300).

ITEMS ALLOWED FOR PICK UP

1. Brush and grass
2. Trees, limbs, and trimmings **under 6' in length**
3. Non-contracted remodeling waste (leftovers from do-it-yourself projects)
4. Furniture
5. Household goods
6. Carpets
7. Mattresses
8. Fencing
9. Large and small household appliances without Freon (with removal certification)

ITEMS NOT ALLOWED FOR PICK UP

1. Bulky waste from commercial business
2. Appliances **with** Freon (without removal certification)
3. Radioactive waste
4. Biomedical waste
5. Commercial hazardous waste
6. Refrigerant and compressed gas containers
7. Houses demolished by owners or contractors
8. Bulky waste illegally deposited on lots
9. Typical household garbage (Sanitation crews collect household garbage twice weekly)
10. Trees, limbs, and trimmings over 6' in length
11. Dirt and rocks
12. Household Hazardous materials (paints, stains, varnishes, cleaners, polishes, automotive products, pesticides, herbicides, etc.)
13. Hazardous materials (acids, caustics, explosives, etc.)
14. Tires of any type
15. Items disposed of from unoccupied dwellings or vacant rental property
16. Other items determined to be inappropriate by the Public Works Director.

The Public Works Director and his designees will make the determination if deposited material is eligible for Grapple Truck Program pick up.

"A RESIDENTIAL CURBSIDE COLLECTION SERVICE FOR THE DISPOSAL OF JUNK, BULKY ITEMS & BRUSH." -Continued

The City Code Enforcement will investigate illegal dumping of material on vacant lots or at residences, and violators will be prosecuted within provision of the law. Fines for illegal dumping will be according to applicable provisions of Ada City Ordinances.

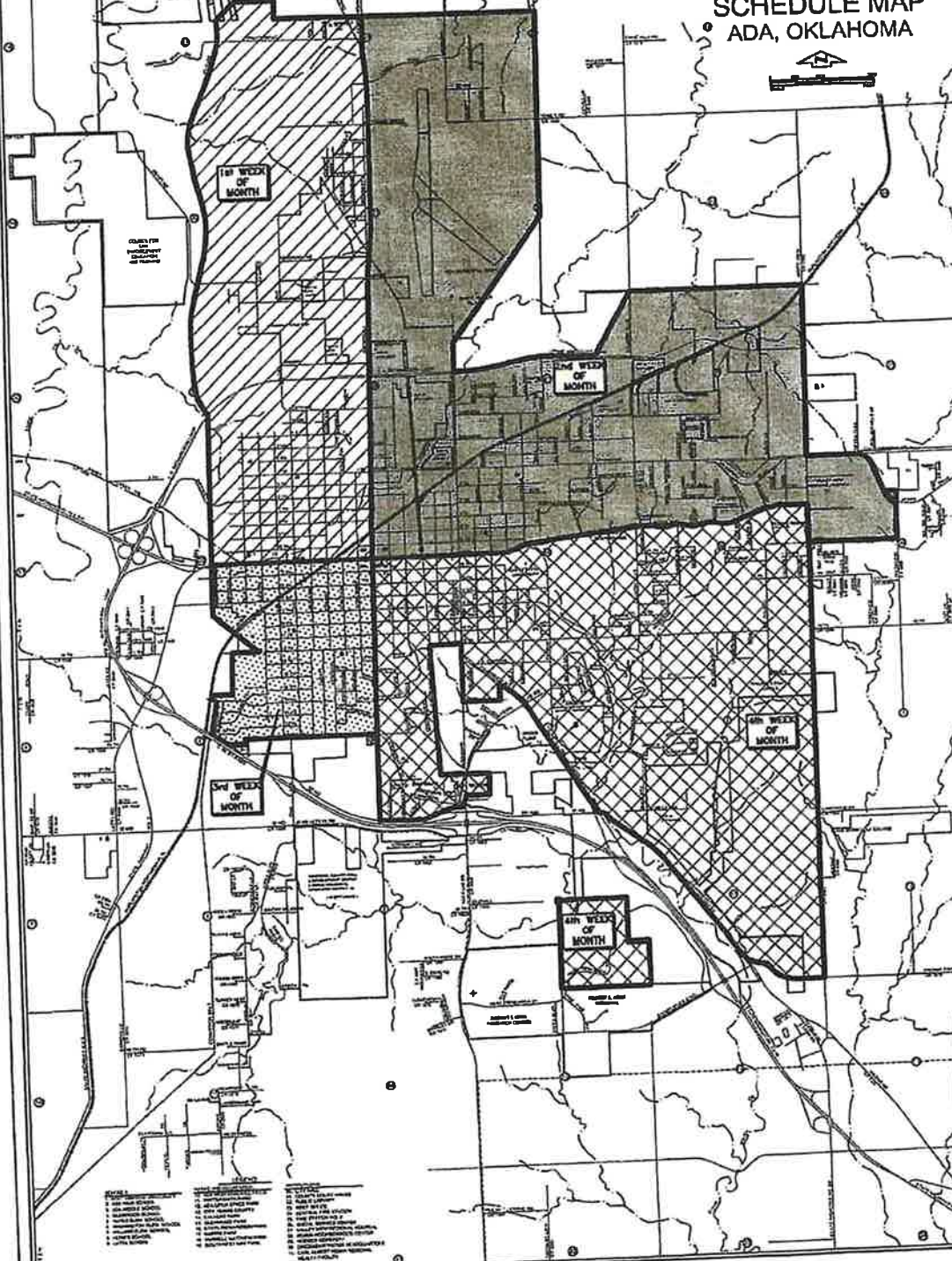
Any business and/or contractor, tree removal, or construction contractor involved in remodeling, building, construction, or other projects is responsible for hauling any bulky waste from a work site to the municipal landfill. Such items are not eligible for Grapple Truck Program removal.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR CURB-SIDE PICK UP UNDER GRAPPLE TRUCK PROGRAM

1. All bulky waste must be placed within ten (10) feet of the curb, pavement edge or road within an accessible open area.
2. Bulky waste must never be placed on top of a water meter, sewer clean out, storm sewer, or manhole.
3. All bulky waste must be set at least five (5) feet from mailboxes, gas meters, cars, shrubs, or anything else that could interfere with mechanical lifting arms.
4. All bulky waste should be placed as far as possible (10' minimum) away from utility poles and low hanging branches of trees to facilitate removal with an overhead grapppler and to prevent contact with overhead power lines.
5. Bulky waste cannot be placed on alleyways, yard easements or driveways.
6. Items picked up at any one time will be limited to no more than four (4) cubic yards of bulky waste (about the size of two refrigerators).
